At the Montclair Art Museum, we are serious about art, creativity, personal growth, friendship, and making the most of summer vacation!

Art camp isn't just for young artists—this summer, your child will explore nature, science, history, mathematics, technology, and more through creative expression.

SummerART programs are designed to cultivate imagination while developing skills in a nurturing and supportive environment. Our youngest campers can choose from many morning camp options. Older campers may select from our focused Afternoon Electives such as Comic Art or Sculpting Studio. A new elective this year, Math + Art, developed in partnership with Fairleigh Dickinson University and co-taught by a math education professor and MAM art instructor, will stimulate creative thinking in new ways with a focus on our Native American collection.

Half day and full day classes for young teens ages 12-15 are available! With choices that range from traditional fine arts media such as drawing, painting, sculpture, and ceramics to digital photography and graphic design in our upgraded Digital Media Lab, **there is an option for any young teen exploring the visual arts or interested in honing their skills this summer.**

Teens 16+ can register for adult studio classes, so look out for a separate catalog in the spring. The **SummerART Counselor and Counselor-in-Training Program** provides great professional experience for older teens and young adults interested in exploring careers in the arts. Our **Studio Art Camp** encourages experimentation, creative thinking and skill development as campers explore a variety of mediums and techniques—drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, collage, printmaking and mixed media. Each session is inspired by a different theme with exciting new projects that provide age-appropriate challenges (campers are grouped in age-specific classes 5-7, 8-9, 10-12). Visits to the galleries and sketching outside on museum grounds enhance learning from observation and appreciation for art as visual communication. Classes are limited to 15 children, so campers receive personalized attention and assistance in finding their own voice for creative expression.

SESSION 1
June 29–July 10*

Fables, Folktales, and Legends

Great stories from days of yore inspire campers with tales of heroic deeds, magical encounters, crafty critters and enchanted environments. Knights, wizards, tricksters, and fairies leap from the page to the paintbrush as campers use their imaginations to create art inspired by literature and embellish their own favorite stories. Fun and fantasy await for the brave of heart!

SESSION 2
July 13–24

Adventures in Time Travel

Blast to the past—then fast forward to the future! Take a historical journey through time to learn about artistic innovation and scientific discoveries of yesteryear: from ancient epochs, to the renaissance period, to the modern age. Campers experiment with a variety of materials and techniques, then activate their imaginations to envision the new styles and inventions of tomorrow. Time flies!



SESSION 3
July 27–August 7

The Wild Life

Every living thing, from flora to fauna, inspires artwork exploring the rich biodiversity of our planet and the interconnectedness of all species, including plants, fungi, mammals, insects and birds. Campers will learn about the habits and habitats of favorite animals and create art inspired by the natural world while experimenting with a diverse array of media and means of representation. Take a walk on the wild side!



SESSION 4
August 10–21

Sail the Seven Seas

Set a course for adventure as we navigate earth's waterways and map a voyage through the wonders of the aquatic world. Mermaids, pirates, sea creatures, and hidden treasures abound as we explore the riches of marine life from coastal tide pools and tropical lagoons to coral reefs and the ocean deep. Whether your camper enjoys sunny days at the beach or high-seas hijinks, this session is sure to inspire. Anchors aweigh!

Taught in our Ceramics Studio, **Pottery Camp** is for children who are interested specifically in working with clay to create pottery, sculpture, and more. Campers are grouped in age-specific classes (6-8 and 9-12) and have the opportunity to use the Museum's diverse collection of Native American pottery as inspiration. Most of the work created in Pottery Camp will be kiln fired; some will be functional, some will be decorative, and all of it will be treasured for years to come. Much of this artwork will be displayed at the receptions in Leir Hall at the end of each session.

In this art and nature camp, held exclusively at **Van Vleck House and Gardens**, campers study and are inspired by the abundant plant and animal life surrounding them. Flora and fauna abound in this secluded historic garden: from butterflies and beetles to birds and buttercups, there is so much to explore! Camp is held outdoors, weather permitting, as well as in Van Vleck's spacious and air-conditioned Education Center. SummerART's professional artist educators teach all camp sessions, and projects include a variety of fine art materials and methods such as drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, and more. Students will have the opportunity to exhibit their work and celebrate what they've learned with family and friends at a closing reception held at the end of each session. We ♥ Digital Art! This camp exposes students to working collaboratively while using new technology as a tool for creative expression and communication in today's digital world. MAM's Digital Media Lab is equipped with Microsoft Surface Pro 6 tablets, Adobe Creative Cloud software, and more for graphic design, video editing, web development, photography, and other applications. Camp is open to all levels and no prior knowledge of software is required; however, basic comfort with a computer is recommended. Students use found images, and MAM's collection, architecture, and grounds, as well as the surrounding community, as sources for inspiration. Campers' work will be saved on the cloud so they can access their projects from home at the end of each session.



SESSION 1
June 29-July 10*

Digital Photography

Campers will explore and capture the world around them using digital photography. Learning about light, contrast, composition, camera settings, and image editing with Photoshop, campers will gain a solid understanding of how to maximize the use of a digital camera to create unique and beautiful works. Canon point-and-shoot cameras are available, but campers may bring their own. A selection of prints will be displayed at the closing reception.

SESSION 2
July 13-24

Digital Animation

For kids who love cartoons and animated movies, this class prepares campers to become the author, director, and animator of their own personal cartoons. Employing traditional as well as digital 2D animation techniques, campers produce their own animated short film. Finished animations will be uploaded to the class YouTube channel and screened at the camp's closing receptions.



SESSION 3
July 27-August 7

Graphic Design

Campers learn the fundamentals of graphic design through a series of hands-on, creative projects. As they explore and play with fonts, images, layering, digital drawing, and photomanipulation tools and techniques, students develop a body of work that expresses their unique voice. As a final project, campers will create an online web portfolio showcasing their work.



SESSION 4
August 10-21

Narrative Filmmaking

Filmmakers in training, campers will learn to use the video camera as a fun and versatile tool for personal expression. Working both independently and collaboratively, campers will create, shoot, and edit short films starring themselves! Campers move beyond the average home movie by exploring exciting video editing and special effects tools in programs such as iMovie and Adobe Premiere Pro. Films will be screened at the closing reception.



Our daily **Creative Challenge** inspires campers to think outside-the-box and find innovative solutions to artistic challenges while having fun. Campers visit museum galleries and respond to creative prompts inspired by current exhibitions, compete in art games, conduct scavenger hunts, produce collaborative artworks, experiment with materials, and engage in creative play. Occurring between our morning camps and afternoon electives, Creative Challenge sparks imagination, problem solving, and teamwork.

Creative Challenge is offered all sessions for Full Day campers only.

Each session has a choice of **Afternoon Electives** from 3:30–5 p.m. Students ages 8–12 may register for an elective only, or as part of a Full-Day Camp.



Sculpture Studio
SESSION 1
June 29–July 10*

In this studio, campers learn fundamental sculpture techniques to create 3-dimensional forms in space, including carving, casting, modeling and assembling—all while using a variety of materials. Skills are developed through individual projects and collaborative large-scale sculptures.

Sketching Studio
SESSION 1
June 29–July 10*

For campers who love to draw, this elective sharpens essential fine art skills by emphasizing foundational drawing techniques such as line, shading, composition, proportion and perspective. Campers use charcoal, pencil, colored pencil, pen and ink, markers, pastels, and more to draw of a variety of subject matter that reflect their own unique personal expressions.

Digital Drawing
SESSION 1
June 29–July 10* **NEW!**
Campers dive into the fundamentals of digital drawing using a tablet, stylus pen, and the Adobe Creative Suite as design tools. Experimenting with green screen photography and a variety of visual effects, campers produce original works of art that will be printed and ready to frame.

Painting Studio

Aspiring painters will learn foundational techniques while using acrylic and tempera paints, watercolors, pastels, and more! Campers will be inspired by landscapes, portraits, and other master paintings from MAM's collection as they gain skills to express their own voice.



Creative Crafts

For campers who love to experiment with functional and decorative crafts, this elective offers projects such as beading, hand sewing, weaving, paper arts, stamp making and more!

Art and Nature at Van Vleck
SESSION 2
July 13–24 **NEW!**

Held at Van Vleck House and Garden, this elective celebrates the natural world as a source of artistic inspiration. Campers draw and paint from direct observation of the abundant plant life, learn techniques for representing different atmospheric conditions, and experiment with natural materials.

Exploring Pottery
SESSION 2
July 13–24
SESSION 4
August 10–21

Campers learn the basics of hand-building and wheel throwing with ceramic clay, applying sculptural techniques and colorful glazes to create a variety of functional and decorative objects, most to be kiln fired.

Fashion Illustration and Design
SESSION 3
July 27–August 7

Campers learn the exaggeration and enhancement of the fashion figure by studying a live clothed model. Campers develop a strong foundation of drawing skills with an introduction to sewing and fabrics, including folds and drapes, as well as textures, colors and patterns.



Print Power
SESSION 3
July 27–August 7

For kids who have something to say and want their voices to be heard! Campers explore the endless possibilities of printmaking as a medium for self-expression. Campers learn techniques such as silkscreen, collagraph, relief printing, monoprint, and stenciling to print their graphics on posters, t-shirts and tote bags.



Comic Art
SESSION 4
August 10–21

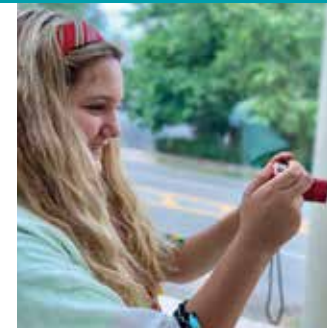
Campers design imaginative and expressive characters inspired by their favorites and learn the basics of comic book art, from storyboarding and composition to speech bubbles and lettering techniques, while producing their own illustrated narrative.

LEGO™ Animation
SESSION 4
August 10–21

Campers learn the art of stop-motion animation using LEGO™ building blocks. Campers build sets and characters while employing visual storytelling techniques to create exciting short films.

Spend your summer immersed in art with other creatives—and grow in a supportive environment! **Teens** can explore traditional fine arts media such as drawing, painting, or ceramics; fine tune their artistic skills; expand their portfolios by developing their unique style; and experiment with digital processes in MAM's Digital Media Lab. You will have the opportunity to be inspired by the artistic processes of professional artists in the Museum's galleries. Family and friends are encouraged to attend the end-of-session exhibitions on the last Friday of each session. Class sizes are limited to ensure lots of one-on-one interaction by the instructors, who are all professional artists. All supplies are provided and all levels and abilities are welcome!



Oil & Acrylic Easel Painting

Explore the foundations of acrylic and oil painting while learning to perceive and depict objects in space through observation of color, shadow and light, and perspective. Learn color theory, color mixing, and new ways of paint application using different types of paint and brushes. Paintings will be inspired by art in the galleries, still life, and a clothed model.

Take your drawing to the next level! Working from observation and reference, we will explore the power of mark-making and the fundamental elements of line, value, form, perspective, composition, and proportion. Subject matter will vary, and include still life, landscapes, clothed figures, architecture, and sketching in the galleries.

Ceramics

SESSION 1

June 29-July 10, 2-5 p.m.*

SESSION 3

July 27-August 7, 2-5 p.m.

Create works of art in clay that are functional, decorative, or both—with an emphasis on individual expression. Projects range from wheel-thrown pots, bowls, vases, and monoprints on clay tiles to unique sculptural hand-built objects. Gain a strong foundation in finishing techniques such as trimming, forming handles and embellishments, texturing, glazing, and preparing work for the kiln.

Digital Photography

SESSION 2

July 13-24, 2-5 p.m.

Learn how to get the most out of your camera by taking it off “automatic” and participating in a series of fun exercises, both on and off site. Train the eye to “see” as you learn traditional photography techniques, re-shoot and re-work photos, and master compositional rules. Experiment with software to make minor adjustments in balance, lighting, and contrast. Students may bring any type of digital camera, or use one of the Museum's point-and-shoot cameras.

Fine Arts Intensive

Study a range of artforms and media and build your portfolio in a summer intensive. Refine your technical skills, explore a new medium, or experiment with a new style. Drawing, oil and acrylic painting, printmaking, and mixed media techniques will all be covered in a relaxed and fun atmosphere. All students will gain a well-rounded knowledge of traditional fine arts media, with a touch of experimentation and adventure to develop their unique voice.

Sculpture Survey
SESSION 3
July 27-August 7, 2-5 p.m.

Ideal for teens who want exposure to three-dimension artmaking processes such as casting, carving, and modeling. The basic elements of design—such as form, line, texture, light, and color—will be addressed to create both abstract and representational sculptural pieces. A variety of media will be used, from clay and wax to plaster, from found objects, to explore both additive and subtractive processes.

Teen Workshop
SESSION 4
August 10-21, 10 a.m.-1 p.m.

This designated open studio time allows independent teens to work on personal projects in a variety of fine art media. With the guidance of a professional artist and moderator, you can develop pieces for your portfolio, try a new medium, get inspired by the work of others, and participate in class critiques. A model for life drawing will be provided for two to three classes. General art supplies for drawing and painting are provided, but specialty materials must be brought from home.

August 10-21, 2-5 p.m.

No longer limited to the realm of print, packaging, and signage, graphic design is now virtually everywhere. Through a series of hands-on creative projects, we will explore visual tools such as composition, color, contrast, hierarchy, scale, depth, rhythm, symbolism, and metaphor. As you engage in digital drawing, digital image acquisition, and manipulation, you will develop your own unique visual voice and transform from a passive media consumer to an active media producer.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR SUMMERART

- REGISTRATION**
- The Montclair Art Museum (MAM) accepts mailed, walk-in, and faxed registrations using the enrollment forms found on the MAM website and processes registrations online. Walk-in registrations may be completed at, and left at, MAM's receptionist desk.
 - Registrations are processed in the order in which they are received and class enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. MAM members at the Friends & Family Level and above can take advantage of priority registration in advance of open enrollment.
 - Registration is complete when MAM is in receipt of full payment. No confirmations will be sent in the mail. An e-mail address is required at time of registration.
 - Classes and camps not meeting a minimum enrollment one week prior to the first day will be canceled.
 - Students enrolling after the start of the session are still required to pay full tuition. Tuition is not pro-rated.
 - MAM will send an e-mail with camp confirmation and parent packet for all child and teen camps. The parent packet includes emergency contact and other forms that must be returned prior to the first day of camp.
 - MAM reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss any student due to inappropriate behavior.

REFUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S AND TEEN'S CLASSES AND CAMPS
Full refunds will be provided in the event that a class or camp does not meet minimum enrollment and is canceled. All other refunds are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee.

Tuition will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is provided at least 30 DAYS prior to start date of the session from which you are withdrawing. If notice of withdrawal is given less than 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the camp from which you are withdrawing, you will receive a 50% refund, less the \$25 administrative fee. No refunds will be given after the start date of the session for which you are enrolled. The \$25 administrative fee and Museum membership are non-refundable.

STUDENT ACCOUNT CREDIT
Student credits are no longer issued. Prior credits are valid for two years from date issued and are not refundable. Contact 973-259-5139 to apply a valid prior credit to a registration.

TRANSFERS
Students may transfer to any camp or class not already filled within the first two days of the SummerART session.

MAKE UP CLASSES + SUBSTITUTE INSTRUCTORS
Due to the full schedule of camps during SummerART, classes will not be made up. Students missing class by their own choice will not receive a make-up class, refund, or credit. MAM reserves the right to substitute instructors of equal caliber in an emergency.

Photographs, videotapes and/or interviews may be taken of children and parents, and photographs, videotapes, or interviews may be published and used to promote MAM's programs. Photographs and video components of student art making and art work may be used for promotional purposes.
