WELCOME TO SUMMER**ART** 2021!

At the Montclair Art Museum, we care about your child and believe art can enhance their health and happiness by cultivating **creativity, self-expression, personal growth, friendships**, and making the most of summer vacation! It has been a tough year, so this summer more than ever, we understand how important it is for kids and teens to be in a supportive and fun learning environment with peers. So, we are excited to offer SummerART as an in-person program this year!

Art camp is for everybody, not just for artists. Campers will explore **nature, science, history, language arts, and more through creative expression**. This summer, studio camps are full day and campers are grouped in age-specific art pods for the entire two-week session. Each session will emphasize different skills and projects to keep campers interested, engaged and always learning new things. We are also thrilled to offer SummerART at Van Vleck House & Gardens again this year, now with the option of morning or afternoon sessions! In addition to studio camp, older kids can also register for morning-only camps in wheel-throwing ceramics or digital media.

Young teens ages 12-15 can choose from a range of morning and afternoon classes from traditional fine arts media such as drawing, painting, illustration, and ceramics to digital photography and digital drawing, or work independently with guidance from a teaching artist in Teen Workshop.

All SummerART programs are taught by professional teaching artists and are designed to cultivate imagination while developing artistic skills in a nurturing and inclusive environment.

Safety is a priority at MAM. Classes will take place in our spacious studios and outdoors on the Museum grounds. All COVID-19 guidelines, including daily temperature checks, mask-wearing and social distancing, will be followed. Each student will be provided with their own set of art supplies so materials will not be shared with others. The Ceramics Studio has been retrofitted with plexiglass dividers, touchless sinks, and improved ventilation.

Whether your child or teen joins us for one session or all summer, we can't wait to get to know you and your family. **Scholarships are available based on merit and financial need.** We are also pleased to offer financial assistance for children with disabilities and special needs.

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SUMMERART SAFETY

SUMMERART can be safe and fun at the same time! We have been welcoming kids and families to in-person classes and programs since January, and hope to see your family at MAM this summer. Keeping everyone safe is a shared responsibility. Please review the COVID-19 safety guidelines for all summer camps and classes at MAM and Van Vleck Gardens below.

Safety guidelines are subject to change based on CDC recommendations.

Instructors, parents/guardians, and students are required to follow these safety protocols:

- An instructor or student who is feeling ill or displaying any symptoms of COVID will not be permitted to attend class. If symptoms arise during class, they will be sent home immediately.
- A questionnaire about health and exposure will be completed upon arrival. If an instructor or student has had contact with someone suspected or lab confirmed to be ill with COVID-19, they will not be permitted to enter the Museum or attend class for 10 days.
- If an instructor or student is suspected or lab-confirmed to be ill with COVID-19, they must go home and not return to the Museum or attend class for 10 days and until they are

fever-free for at least 72 hours (3 days) without medication, other symptoms have improved, and it has been at least 7 days since onset of symptoms.

Safety Guidelines

- Temperatures for all staff, instructors, and students will be taken and recorded daily.
- All staff and students must wash or sanitize their hands when coming into class and every hour.
- Hand sanitizers are available for staff and student use.
- All staff and students must wear masks coverings over their nose and mouth.
- All staff and students must maintain a minimum of 6 feet from all others.
- Staff members and students cannot share any equipment or supplies, and each student will have designated supplies to use during camp.
- Students attending full day camp will eat lunch and have recess outside or under a tent.
- Parents, guardians, or caregivers must be present for drop-off, as MAM reserves the right to refuse admission to any student with incomplete health forms, elevated temperatures, or COVID-19 exposure concerns.
- Parents, guardians, or caregivers must be able to pick up their child within one hour's notice if children display any COVID-19 symptoms, or other illness.
- MAM reserves the right to cancel a camp or class or transfer a camp or class to the online Zoom platform at any time, in the event of possible COVID-19 exposure.



WAIVER

We are working to keep you safe and healthy, but we cannot guarantee complete elimination of possible exposure to COVID-19. By entering the Museum you assume the risk of such exposure. We are taking extra precautions in our classrooms including disinfecting the space before and after each class. All students and instructors are required to wash their hands before entering the classroom, and repeat once every hour class is in session. Students and instructors must maintain a minimum of 6 feet distance from each other and are required to wear a mask that covers their mouth and nose completely. Please do not attend class if you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19.

CERAMICS STUDIO

The Ceramics Studio has plexiglass dividers between wheels to the left, right, and in front of each student and to the front of each student, touchless sinks with foot pedals, improved air circulation, and an enhanced cleaning protocol between classes.

SUMMERART AT VAN VLECK

All attendees of camp at Van Vleck House and Gardens are required to sign a waiver specific to this off-site location. The waiver will be provided upon registration.

All Studio Art Camps meet from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with supervised lunch and recess. Session themes continue through the Afternoon Focus.

Our in-person **Studio Art Camp** encourages experimentation, creative thinking, and skill development in a safe, fun, supportive, and socially engaging environment with other creative kids. Campers are grouped in age-specific art pods led by our professional Teaching Artists, with enrollment limited to 12 children to enhance social distancing and increase personalized attention.

Each session is inspired by a different theme with exciting new projects providing age-appropriate challenges for campers to explore a variety of mediums and techniques in drawing, painting, sculpture, collage, and mixed media. Lunch and recess will be supervised for safety and social distancing with organized games and activities. Afternoons will focus on specialized instruction in a different art form, such as comic art or printmaking, so campers can sharpen medium-specific skills and develop their own voice for creative self-expression.

Classes will take place in our spacious studios and outdoors on the Museum grounds. All COVID-19 guidelines, including mask-wearing and social distancing, will be followed, for a safe, social, creative experience. Each camper will be provided with their own art supplies so materials will not be shared with others.

PAINTING

Campers learn foundational painting techniques such as color mixing, blending, and building texture, while experimenting with a variety of wet media.



COMIC ART

Campers design imaginative characters and learn the basics of comic book art from storyboarding and composition, to speech bubbles and lettering.



PRINTMAKING

Campers explore the endless possibilities of printmaking as a medium for self-expression, learning techniques such as silkscreen, collagraph, relief printing, and monoprint.



PUPPETRY

Campers create a variety of puppets such as hand puppets, shadow puppets, and marionettes, as well as a basic theatre set.



SCULPTURE

Campers learn fundamental sculpture techniques to create 3-D forms in space using a variety of materials and methods.

Everyone's favorite art and nature camp is back with SummerART at Van Vleck! Held exclusively at **Van Vleck House and Gardens**, campers create works of art inspired by the abundant plant and animal life onsite. Flora and fauna abound in this secluded historic garden; from butterflies and beetles, to birds and buttercups, there is so much to explore!

Camp is held outdoors when weather permits, as well as in Van Vleck's spacious Education Center. MAM's fantastic professional Teaching Artists lead fun-filled projects featuring a variety of fine art materials and methods such as drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, and more.

Reboot your summer and learn to use technology as a tool for creative expression and communication in our **Digital Media Camp**. Level up your production skills working with professional Digital Teaching Artists to learn essential tricks of the trade, while refining your personal vision through a series of design challenges. Develop fundamental and indispensable production techniques and find your own voice in becoming a prolific cultural producer in our increasingly connected world.

Enrollment is limited to enhance social distancing and increase personalized attention and skill-building support. Digital Media Camp is open to all levels of experience and no prior knowledge of software is required. Camps will take place in our spacious Museum galleries, using state-of-the-art Surface Pro tablet computers and Adobe Creative Cloud software. In the event that the Museum must close or a class must quarantine, camp will continue online via Zoom and instruction will utilize free open-source computer programs and readily available digital production tools.

Digital Drawing

Take your drawing into the digital realm using a touchscreen tablet, stylus pen, and Adobe Photoshop as design tools. Experiment with a variety of visual effects such as mark making, layering and adding color, while learning essential graphic design principals and techniques. Your original works of art will be printed to take home and ready to frame!

Digital Animation

For kids who love cartoons and animated movies, this class teaches the core skills needed to become the author, director, and animator of your own personal cartoons. Learn traditional as well as digital 2D animated motion production techniques to bring your own characters to life and turn your own stories into original animated short films.

Spend your summer immersed in art in a supportive environment with other young creatives while building your portfolio! **Teens ages 12-15** can explore traditional fine arts media such as drawing, painting, or illustration, fine tune their skills in a range of media in the Fine Arts Intensive, work independently in an open studio in Teen Workshop, develop their unique style in the Ceramics Studio, and experiment with digital processes in MAM's digital arts program. Classes include individual and group critiques in a supportive environment and exercises on writing a statement about your art. All levels and abilities are welcome!

Sign-up for the morning or afternoon program or both. Due to safety restrictions, a full day option is not available. Students enrolled in both morning and afternoon teen classes must be picked up at the end of the morning class and dropped back off at the start of the afternoon class. Supervision will not be provided during this time.

SESSION 2

Take your drawing into the digital realm using a digital tablet, stylus pen, and Adobe Photoshop. Create original drawings through mark making, layering and adding color. Bring your drawings to life by exporting them to prints, digital animations, gifs, videos, and signage while learning about the elements of graphic design. All materials provided—just bring your imagination!



Digital Photography

SESSION 1*

June 28-July 9, 2:30-4:30 p.m.

Learn how to get the most out of your camera by taking it off “automatic,” through a series of fun exercises, both on and off site. Train the eye to “see” as you learn traditional photography techniques, re-shoot and re-work photos, and master compositional rules. Experiment with software to make minor adjustments in balance, lighting, and contrast. Students may bring any type of digital camera, or use one of the Museum's point-and-shoot cameras.

Take your drawing to the next level! Working from observation and reference, we will explore the power of mark-making and the fundamental elements of line, value, form, perspective, composition, and proportion. Subject matter will vary, and include still life, landscapes, clothed figures, and architecture.

- REGISTRATION**
- The Montclair Art Museum (MAM) accepts registrations online, by phone at 973-259-5139, or by e-mail to yardschool@montclairartmuseum.org. Walk-in registrations cannot be accepted.
 - Registrations are processed in the order in which they are received and class enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. MAM members at any level can take advantage of priority registration in advance of open enrollment.
 - Registration is complete when MAM is in receipt of full payment. No confirmations will be sent in the mail. An e-mail, mailing address, and phone number are required at time of registration.
 - Classes and camps not meeting a minimum enrollment one week prior to the first day will be canceled.
 - Students enrolled in both morning and afternoon teen classes must be picked up at the end of the morning class and dropped back off at the start of the afternoon class. Supervision will not be provided during this time.
 - Students enrolled in both morning and afternoon sessions at Van Vleck Gardens must be picked up at the end of the morning session and dropped back off at the start of the afternoon session. Supervision will not be provided during this time.
 - Students enrolling after the start of the session are still required to pay full tuition. Tuition is not pro-rated.
 - MAM will send an e-mail with camp confirmation and parent packet for all child camps and teen classes that includes forms to be filled out prior to the first day of camp.
 - MAM reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss any student due to inappropriate behavior as outlined in the SummerART parent packet.
 - Student credits are no longer issued.

REFUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S CAMPS AND TEEN'S CLASSES DURING SUMMERART
 Full refunds will be provided in the event that a class, workshop, or camp does not meet minimum enrollment and is canceled. All other refunds are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee.
 Tuition will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is provided at least 30 DAYS prior to start date of the summer session from which you are withdrawing. If notice of withdrawal is given less than 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the session from which you are withdrawing, you will receive a 50% refund, less the \$25 administrative fee.
