Creative sparks fly at MAM's SummerART, a vibrant hub where artists come to share, explore, grow, and emerge transformed.

We care about your child and invite them to cultivate creativity, self-expression, personal growth, and friendships with us! SummerART programs are taught by professional Teaching Artists and are designed to foster a nurturing, supportive, accessible, and inclusive environment.

During our two-week sessions, campers ages 6-12 will harness their creative imaginations through exploring nature and ocean life, multiculturalism, history, literacy and storytelling, and social and emotional learning. Camp takes place in MAM's spacious studios and grounds, as well as Van Vleck House & Gardens. Older kids can register for morning-only camps in wheel-throwing ceramics or digital media.

Young teens ages 12–15 may choose a range of morning and afternoon classes from traditional fine art media and ceramics to contemporary practices, and supervised lunch is available for those staying all day.

Our in-person **Studio Art Camp** encourages experimentation, creative thinking, and skill development in a safe, fun, supportive, and socially engaging environment with other creative kids. Campers are in agespecific groups led by our professional Teaching Artists, with limited enrollment to increase personalized attention. Classes will take place in our spacious studios and outdoors in tented classrooms on the Museum grounds.

Each session is inspired by a different theme with exciting new projects providing age-appropriate challenges for campers to explore a variety of mediums and techniques in drawing, painting, sculpture, collage, and mixed media. Supervised lunch and recess take place outside with organized games and activities. Afternoons focus on specialized instruction in a different art form, such as comic art or printmaking, so campers can sharpen medium-specific skills and develop their own unique voice for creative self-expression.

SCULPTURE

Campers learn fundamental sculpture techniques to create 3-dimensional forms in space using a variety of materials and methods.



COMIC ART

Campers design imaginative characters and learn the basics of comic book art, from storyboarding and composition to speech bubbles and lettering techniques.



PUPPETRY

Campers create a variety of puppets, such as hand puppets, shadow puppets, and marionettes, as well as a basic theater set.



FIBER ARTS

Campers will learn fundamental textile and fiber art skills to create a wide variety of creative ways to use materials like fabric and varn.



PRINTMAKING

Campers explore the endless possibilities of printmaking as a medium for self-expression, learning techniques such as silkscreen, collagraph, relief printing, monoprint, and stenciling.

Held exclusively at Van Vleck House and Gardens, campers create works of art inspired by the abundant plant and animal life on site. Flora and fauna abound in this secluded historic garden; from butterflies and beetles, to birds and buttercups. there is so much to explore!

MAM's fantastic professional Teaching Artists lead fun-filled projects featuring a variety of fine art materials and methods such as drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, and more. Campers will learn about the habits and habitats of animals and create art inspired by the natural world while experimenting with a diverse array of media and means of creative expression.

Camps take place in our Media Lab and include walking trips in nearby Montclair, using state-of-the-art Surface Pro tablet computers and Adobe Creative Cloud software.

Campers learn the fundamentals of graphic design through a series of hands-on, creative projects. As they explore and play with fonts, images, layering, digital drawing, and photo manipulation tools and techniques, students develop a body of work that expresses their unique voice using Adobe Suite programs such as Photoshop and Illustrator.

Digital Drawing

Welcome to the world of digital drawing, where your sketches come alive on your screen using a Surface Pro tablet, stylus pen, and Adobe Photoshop as design tools. Experiment with markmaking, layering, and adding color, while learning essential graphic design and illustration principles and techniques. Your original works of art will be printed to take home and ready to frame!



SESSION 3

Digital Photography

Campers will explore and capture the world around them using digital photography. Learning about light, contrast, composition. camera settings, and image editing with Photoshop CC, campers will gain a solid understanding of how to maximize the use of a digital camera to create unique and beautiful works of photography. Canon pointand-shoot cameras are available, but campers may bring their own as well.



SESSION 4 August 5-16

Digital Drawing: Manga

If your child enjoys manga, anime, comics, and cartoons. this camp will allow them to learn the fundamentals of creating their own paneled world. Campers will develop their own style of illustration with drawing exercises and class discussions based on popular anime and manga. From character design, storyboarding, and backgrounds, campers will bring their sketches to life using digital tools-Microsoft Surface Pro tablets, stylus pens. and Adobe Photoshop.

Your child will engage in hands-on activities, including fabric dyeing, weaving, and embroidery, to elevate your understanding of fiber arts. POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR SUMMERART

REGISTRATION: Begins January 22 for members and January 29 for the public

- Registrations can be made online any time, or in person Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Registrations are processed in the order in which they are received and class enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. MAM members can take advantage of priority registration in advance of open enrollment.
- Registration is complete when MAM receives full payment. No confirmations will be sent in the mail. An email, mailing address, and phone number are required at the time of registration.
- Classes and camps not meeting a minimum enrollment one week before the first day will be canceled.
- Students enrolling after the start of the session are still required to pay full tuition. Tuition is not prorated.
- MAM will send an email with camp confirmation and parent packet for all kids camps and teen classes that includes forms to be filled out before the first day of camp.
- MAM reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss any student due to inappropriate behavior as outlined in the SummerART parent packet.

REFUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S CAMPS AND TEEN'S CLASSES DURING SUMMERART

Full refunds will be provided in the event that a class, workshop, or camp does not meet minimum enrollment and is canceled. All other refunds are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee. Students can receive credits if a class, workshop, or camp is canceled. Credits are valid for two years from date issued and are not refundable. Credits are held in the students' account and can be redeemed upon registration.

Tuition will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is provided at least 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the summer session from which you are withdrawing. If notice of withdrawal is given less than 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the session from which you are withdrawing, you will receive a 50% refund, less the \$25 administrative fee. No refunds will be given after the start date of the session for which you are enrolled. The \$25 administrative fee and Museum membership are non-refundable.

TRANSFERS

Students may transfer to any camp or class not already filled within the first two weeks of classes or first two days of the SummerART kids and teen session.

Due to the full schedule of camps and teen classes during SummerART, classes will not be made up. Students missing class by their own choice will not receive a make-up class, refund, or credit. MAM reserves the right to substitute instructors of equal caliber, if necessary.

Materials for children's and young teen courses and camps are provided. Spray paints, fixatives, and aerosols are prohibited. Each student will receive their own supplies for use during the camp session.

MEMBERSHIP

Member benefits include priority registration and significantly reduced class fees for studio classes, workshops, and camps. Therefore, to be eligible for the reduced member rate for children's and teen's classes or camps, the student's family must have a current Family level or higher membership. Membership dues may be paid at the time of registration but we encourage families to purchase membership in advance of priority registration.
