Our **Studio Art Camp** encourages a summer of experimentation, creative thinking, and skill development in a safe, fun, supportive, and socially engaging environment. Campers are divided into age-specific groups led by our professional Teaching Artists, with limited enrollment for personalized attention. Classes take place in our spacious studios and include creative time on the Museum grounds.

Each two-week camp session is inspired by a different theme with exciting new projects that explore a variety of mediums and techniques in drawing, painting, sculpture, collage, and mixed media. Supervised lunch and recess take place outside with organized games and activities. Afternoons focus on specialized instruction in different art forms, such as comic art or printmaking, where you can sharpen medium-specific skills and develop your own unique voice for creative self-expression.

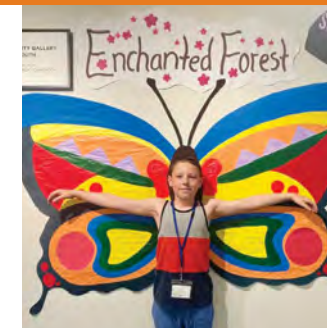

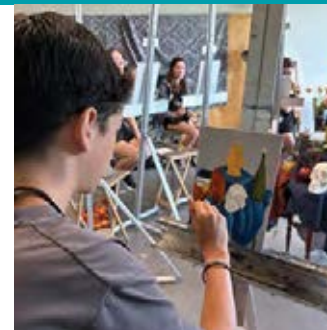

**Teens ages 13-17** can choose from medium-specific traditional fine arts such as drawing, painting, or illustration; fine-tune their skills in a range of media in the Fine Arts Intensive; explore special projects in Teen Workshop; and work on the potter's wheel in the Ceramics Studio. Classes include individual and group critiques in a supportive environment and exercises on writing a statement about your art.

Sign up for the morning or afternoon program, or pack a lunch and stay for both! Lunch supervision is provided on Museum grounds. Class sizes are limited for individualized attention by our professional Teaching Artists, who will provide each student with a separate set of art supplies to use for the duration of the class. All levels and abilities are welcome!



#### **Oil & Acrylic Easel Painting**

Study the foundations of acrylic and oil painting while learning to perceive and depict objects in space through observation of color, shadow and light, and perspective. Learn color theory, color mixing, and new ways of paint application using different mediums and brushes. Paintings will be inspired by the landscape, still life, and a clothed model.

All students will gain a well-rounded knowledge of traditional fine arts media, with a touch of experimentation and adventure to develop unique artistic voices.



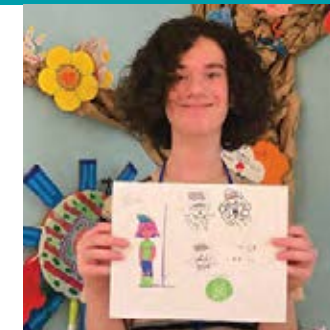
#### **Figure Drawing**

Elevate your figure drawing abilities with clothed live models to explore the human form! Students will delve into the art of both sketching and painting techniques, refining their ability to portray expressive figures and precise proportions. Immerse yourself in the nuanced task of capturing life-like gestures, providing an opportunity for growth and artistic exploration. This class promises an exciting avenue for honing your craft using live models as your muse!



#### **Teen Manga**

For teens who enjoy manga, anime, comics, and cartoons, learn the fundamentals of creating your own paneled world. Develop your own style of illustration through drawing exercises and class discussions based on anime and manga, a popular style of Japanese graphic novels that has a long history in Japanese art. From character design to storyboarding and backgrounds, this course is geared towards bringing sketches to life using manual and digital tools!

**Cartoons & Characters**

Enhance your personal style through traditional drawing and creative brainstorming exercises to create the foundation for a three-page story. By the end of the course, you will be able to design unique characters, create scripts, and apply those skills to draw and color characters and comics with digital tools. This camp utilizes mixed media drawing tools, Microsoft Surface Pro tablets, and stylus pens. Bring the worlds you have imagined to life with Cartoons and Characters!



**Visual Storytelling**

Award-winning graphic novelist Kevin C. Pyle will introduce students to all the visual story-telling tools of graphic novels including expressions, gestures, panel design, and pacing, ultimately producing a short comic of their own! In this class, character design and setting as an engine for storytelling are emphasized. Artists of all skill levels are welcome.



**Ceramics**

Create works of art in clay that are functional, decorative, or both—with an emphasis on individual expression. Throwing techniques for centering clay, creating bowls, and cylindrical forms will be covered, followed by finishing techniques, such as glazing, texturing, and preparing the work for the kiln.

## POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR SUMMERART

**REGISTRATION:** Begins January 26 at 10 a.m. for members, and February 2 at 10 a.m. for the public.

- Registrations can be made online any time, or in person Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Registrations are processed in the order in which they are received and class enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. MAM members can take advantage of priority registration in advance of open enrollment.
- Registration is complete when MAM receives full payment. No confirmations will be sent in the mail. An email, mailing address, and phone number are required at the time of registration.
- Classes and camps not meeting a minimum enrollment one week before the first day will be canceled.
- Students enrolling after the start of the session are still required to pay full tuition. Tuition is not prorated.
- MAM will send an email with camp confirmation and a parent letter two weeks prior to the first day of all camps. This letter will include Emergency Forms that need to be completed and submitted immediately so that we have all the necessary information for your child before camp begins.
- MAM reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss any student due to inappropriate behavior as outlined in the SummerART parent packet.

## REFUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S CAMPS AND TEEN'S CLASSES DURING SUMMERART

Full refunds will be provided in the event that a class, workshop, or camp does not meet minimum enrollment and is canceled. All other refunds are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee.

Tuition will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is provided at least 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the summer session from which you are withdrawing. If notice of withdrawal is given less than 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the session from which you are withdrawing, you will receive a 50% refund, less the \$25 administrative fee. No refunds will be given after the start date of the session for which you are enrolled. The \$25 administrative fee and Museum membership are non-refundable.
