At the Montclair Art Museum, we are serious about art, creativity, personal growth, friendship, and fun!

Our camps and classes teach children to think creatively so they can design their own futures. SummerART programs are designed to cultivate imagination while developing skills, with increasing challenges so children can grow from budding young artist to accomplished teens. Whether your child aspires to be a scientist, politician, entrepreneur, or professional artist, **the tools gained at MAM will help them express their ideas and creatively solve problems.**

We've made a lot of changes to the summer program for kids and teens this year. Our youngest campers can choose from many morning camp options. Older campers may select from our focused Afternoon Electives, such as Comic Art and Sculpting Studio—both new this year! We are particularly excited about the daily **Creativity Challenge** included in the full day program. Campers will respond to creative prompts inspired by Museum exhibitions, compete in art games, and work in teams to create collaborative artworks. This is one of many ways we are strengthening our ability to serve students with a range of learning styles and interests. **Full Day Camps for ages 12-15 are now available!** With choices like Global Fiber Arts, Oil and Acrylic

Easel Painting, Graphic Design, Drawing, and Ceramics, there is something for any young teen exploring the visual arts or interested in building their skills over the summer.

Teens 16+ can register for evening or weekend **adult studio classes**; registration opens in May. Look out for a separate catalog. The **SummerART Counselor and Counselor-in-Training Program** provides great professional experience for older teens and young adults interested in exploring careers in the arts. Our **Studio Art Camp** encourages experimentation, creative thinking and skill development as campers explore a variety of mediums and techniques—drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, collage, printmaking and mixed media. Each session is inspired by a different theme with exciting new projects that provide age-appropriate challenges (campers are grouped in age-specific classes 5-7, 8-9, 10-12). Visits to the galleries and sketching outside on Museum grounds enhance learning from observation and appreciation for art as visual communication. Classes are limited to 15 children, so campers receive personalized attention and assistance finding their own voice for creative expression.



SESSION 1
June 24–28 (one week only)
Under the Sea

Make a splash! Take a deep dive into the cool blue to explore the fantastic creatures and hidden treasures that make up marine life. Whether your camper prefers high-seas adventures or a sunny day at the beach, this session delights with artwork inspired by the wonders of the aquatic world.



SESSION 2
July 1–12*
Full Steam Ahead

Gear up and travel the world while exploring kinetic art and the mechanics of locomotion in this session informed by STEAM curriculum. Planes, trains, submarines, and other forms of transportation propel this mobile adventure across the globe as campers experiment with a variety of media to create their own wayfaring inventions.

SESSION 3
July 15–26
Mythological Worlds

Curiouser and curiouser! Through the looking glass, over the rainbow, or via Platform 9¾, this session delves into the magical realms of fable, fairy tale, and fantasy. Unicorns, dragons, wizards, and pixies inspire art that activates the imagination and becomes stuff of legend!



SESSION 4
July 29–August 9
Wild at Heart

Hear me roar! From rainforest jungles to arctic icecaps to savannah deserts, this session explores Earth's rich ecosystems and the diverse wildlife residing within. Campers will look at the habits and habitats of the wild animals we love and create artwork inspired by the natural world.



SESSION 5
August 12–23
Reach for the Stars

Blast off! Explore the night sky, our solar system, and the mysteries of the cosmos, from extraterrestrial life to intergalactic travel. Whether your camper enjoys stargazing, moon-walking, or space exploration, this session sparks the imagination with artwork inspired by twinkling nocturnal landscapes and astronomical views of outer space. We are all made of stardust!

Taught in our Ceramics Studio, **Pottery Camp** is for children who are interested specifically in working with clay to create pottery, sculpture, and more. Campers are grouped in age-specific classes (6-8 and 9-12) and have the opportunity to use the Museum's diverse collection of Native American pottery as inspiration. Most of the work created in Pottery Camp will be kiln fired; some will be functional, some will be decorative, and all of it will be treasured for years to come. Much of this artwork will be displayed at the receptions in Leir Hall at the end of each session.

Held exclusively at **Van Vleck House and Gardens**, campers create works of art inspired by the abundant plant and animal life that surrounds them. Flora and fauna abounds in this secluded historic garden; from butterflies and beetles, to birds and buttercups, there is so much to explore! Camp is held outdoors when weather permits, as well as in Van Vleck's spacious and air-conditioned Education Center. SummerART's fantastic teaching artists will teach camp sessions, and projects include a variety of fine art materials and methods such as drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, and more. Students will have the opportunity to exhibit their work and celebrate what they've learned with family and friends at a closing reception held at the end of each session. We ♥ Digital Art! This camp exposes students to working collaboratively while using new technology as a tool for creative expression and communication in our increasingly connected and digital world. MAM's Digital Media Lab is equipped with iMacs and Adobe Creative Cloud software for graphic design, video editing, web development, photography, and other applications. Camp is open to all levels and no prior knowledge of software is required; however, basic comfort using a computer is recommended. Campers' work will be saved on the cloud so they can access their projects from home at the end of each session.



SESSION 2
July 1-July 12*

Digital Photography

Campers will explore and capture the world around them using digital photography. Learning about light, contrast, composition, camera settings, and image editing with Photoshop CC, campers will gain a solid understanding of how to maximize the use of a digital camera to create unique and beautiful works of photography. Canon point-and-shoot cameras are available, but campers may bring their own as well. A selection of prints will be displayed at the closing reception.

SESSION 3
July 15-26

Graphic Art

This camp introduces students to the fundamentals of graphic design through a series of hands-on, creative projects. As they explore and play with fonts, images, layering, digital drawing and photo manipulation tools and techniques, students develop a body of work that expresses their unique voice. As a final project, campers will create an online web portfolio showcasing their work.

SESSION 4

Digital Animation

For kids who love cartoons and animated movies, this class prepares campers to become the author, director, and animator of their own personal cartoons. Employing traditional as well as digital 2D animation techniques, campers produce their own animated short film. Finished animations will be uploaded to the class YouTube channel and screened at the camp's closing reception.



SESSION 5
August 12-23

Narrative Filmmaking

Filmmakers in training, campers will learn to use the video camera as a fun and versatile tool for personal expression. Working both independently and collaboratively, campers will create, shoot, and edit short films starring themselves! Campers move beyond your average home movie by exploring exciting video editing and special effects tools in programs such as iMovie and Adobe Premiere Pro. Films will be screened at the closing reception for friends and family.



NEW!

Our new daily **Creative Challenge** inspires campers to find innovative solutions to artistic challenges while having fun. Working in teams, campers will respond to creative prompts inspired by Museum exhibitions, compete in art games, conduct scavenger hunts, produce collaborative artworks, and exercise their creative muscles.

Creative Challenge is offered all five sessions for Full Day campers only.

Each session has a choice of **Afternoon Electives** from 3:30–5 p.m. Students ages 8–12 may register for an elective only, or as part of a Full Day Camp.

Sculpting Studio
SESSION 2
July 1-12

In this studio, campers learn fundamental sculpture techniques to create 3 dimensional forms in space, such as carving, casting, modeling and assembling, using a variety of materials. Skills are developed through individual projects, then campers work collaboratively to create large scale sculptures that defy the imagination.

Creative Crafts
SESSION 1

For campers who love to experiment with functional and decorative crafts, this elective offers projects such as beading, hand sewing, weaving, paper arts, stamp making and more!



Exploring Pottery
SESSION 2
July 1-12
SESSION 4
July 29-August 9

With a focus on hand-built pottery and basic wheel throwing, this elective uses a variety of clay and sculptural techniques to produce creative and unique objects, including several pieces to be fired in a kiln. Using a multicultural approach, campers will use ceramic clay, and colorful glazes to create both functional and decorative objects, such as pots, masks, creatures, and animals.



Sketching Studio
SESSION 2
July 1-12
SESSION 4
July 29-August 9

For campers who love to draw, this elective develops this essential aspect of fine art by emphasizing foundational drawing techniques, such as line, shading, composition, proportion and perspective using a variety of subject matter. Students will use charcoal, pencil, colored pencil, pen and ink, colored markers, pastels, and more to create drawings that are their own unique expressions.

Creative Coding
SESSION 3
July 15-26

Learn how to code! Campers will be introduced to basic computer science concepts from pixels and colors in the digital space to variables and conditional statements. Campers will learn the highly visual language of Processing (Java) while applying logic and problem-solving skills to create interactive animations.

Fashion Illustration & Design
SESSION 3
July 15-26

Work the runway! Campers in this elective learn the exaggeration and enhancement of the fashion figure by studying a live clothed model. They develop a strong foundation of drawing skills with an introduction to sewing and fabrics, including folds and drapes, as well as textures, colors and patterns. Campers design and create a piece of wearable art that they can model for friends and family at our closing reception.



Print Power
SESSION 4
July 29-August 9

For kids who have something to say and want their voices to be heard! Campers in this class will explore the endless possibilities of printmaking as a medium for self-expression. Campers will learn techniques such as silkscreen, collagraph, relief printing, monoprint, and stenciling to print their stylized graphics on posters, flyers, stickers, postcards, t-shirts and totebags and more.

Comic Art
SESSION 5
August 12-23

Campers will design imaginative and expressive characters inspired by their favorites and learn the basics of comic book art from storyboarding and composition to speech bubbles and lettering techniques while producing their own illustrated narrative.

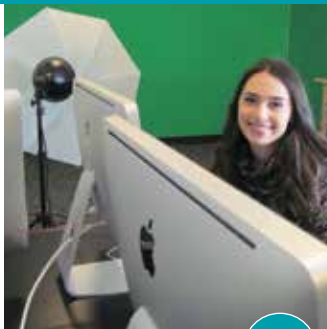


Lego™ Animation
SESSION 5
August 12-23

Learn the art of stop-motion animation using Lego™ building blocks. Campers will have the opportunity to create sets and characters, creating exciting short films that set them on the path to becoming a master builder. With a focus on visual storytelling techniques, Lego Animation is the perfect opportunity to let your imagination run wild!

Spend your summer with other creative people, immersed in art in a supportive environment! MAM has a wide range of summer classes for teens to correspond to teens' varied interests. Teens explore traditional fine arts media such as drawing, painting, or ceramics, discover new techniques such as silk painting, or experiment with digital processes in MAM's Digital Media Lab. Fine arts vocabulary and art history will be introduced through visits to the Museum's galleries. Family and friends are encouraged to attend the end-of-session exhibitions on the last Friday of each two-week session. Classes are led by professional artists. All supplies are provided and all levels and abilities are welcome!

Video Game & Animation Design

SESSION 1

June 24-28, 10 a.m.-1 p.m.

Do you have artistic ideas that you want to express in a game or simple animation? Processing is a programming language focused specifically on graphics—designed for artists, game developers, and graphic designers. If you want to see your artwork in motion, or share your visual ideas with others whether in a game or as a story, than this class is for you!

Projects range from wheel-thrown pots, bowls, vases, and monoprints on clay tiles, to unique sculptural hand-built objects. Gain a strong foundation of finishing techniques, such as trimming, forming handles and embellishments, texturing, glazing, and preparing the work for the kiln.

Digital Photography

July 1-12, 2-5 p.m.

Learn how to get the most out of your camera by taking it off "automatic," through a series of fun exercises, both on and off site. Train the eye to "see" as you learn traditional photography techniques, re-shoot and re-work photos, and master compositional rules. Experiment with software to make minor adjustments in balance, lighting, and contrast. Students may bring any type of digital camera, or use one of the Museum's point-and-shoot cameras.

**Global Fiber Arts
SESSION 3
July 15-26, 10 a.m.-1 p.m.**

Fiber arts are ancient yet current, and can be decorative or wearable. Discover a variety of fiber art techniques from different traditions around the world in a fun and experimental environment. We will explore varied media and processes such as silk painting, faux batik with glue and crayons, hand-carved block prints on fabric, Indian tie-dye and Shibori—Japanese tie dye.

**Sculpture Survey
SESSION 3
July 15-26, 2-5 p.m.**

Ideal for teens who want exposure to three-dimensional artmaking processes such as casting, carving, and modeling. The basic elements of design—such as form, line, texture, light, and color—will be addressed to create both abstract and representational sculptural pieces. A variety of media will be used, from clay and wax, to plaster and found objects, to explore both additive and subtractive processes.

**Graphic Design
SESSION 4

No longer limited to the realm of print, packaging, and signage, graphic design is now virtually everywhere. Through a series of hands-on creative projects, we will explore visual tools such as composition, color, contrast, hierarchy, scale, depth, rhythm, symbolism, and metaphor. As you engage in digital drawing, digital image acquisition, and manipulation, you will develop your own unique visual voice and transform from a passive media consumer to an active media producer.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR SUMMERART

- REGISTRATION**
- The Museum accepts mailed, walk-in, and faxed registrations using the enrollment forms found on the MAM website and processes registrations online. Walk-in registrations may be completed at, and left at, MAM's receptionist desk.
 - Registrations are processed in the order in which they are received and class enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. Museum members at the Friends & Family Level and above can take advantage of priority registration in advance of open enrollment.
 - Registration is complete when MAM is in receipt of full payment. No confirmations will be sent in the mail. An e-mail address is required at time of registration.
 - Classes and camps not meeting a minimum enrollment one week prior to the first day will be canceled.
 - Students enrolling after the start of the session are still required to pay full tuition. Tuition is not pro-rated.
 - MAM will send an e-mail with camp confirmation and parent packet for all child and teen camps that includes emergency contact and other forms to be returned prior to the first day of camp.
 - MAM reserves the right to refuse admission or dismiss any student due to inappropriate behavior.

- REFUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S AND TEEN'S CLASSES AND CAMPS**
- Full refunds will be provided in the event that a class or camp does not meet minimum enrollment and is canceled. All other refunds are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee.

Tuition will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is provided at least 30 DAYS prior to start date of the camp session from which you are withdrawing. If notice of withdrawal is given less than 30 DAYS prior to the start date of the camp from which you are withdrawing, you will receive a 50% refund, less the \$25 administrative fee. No refunds will be given after the start date of the session for which you are enrolled.

STUDENT ACCOUNT CREDIT
Students who withdraw on the first or second day of camp/class will be issued a nonrefundable account credit. All credits are subject to a nonrefundable \$25 administrative fee. Credits will be issued for the remaining class/camp days only. After the second day, no credits will be issued. Credits will be valid for two years from date issued. The \$25 administrative fee and MAM membership are non-refundable.
